# King Cobra *Ophiophagus hannah* in southern Panay Island, Philippines

Location: Panay Island, Iloilo Province, Municipality of Tigbauan, Barangay Parara Sur, Philippines.

Elevation: 17 metres ASL.

Habitat: Residential area surrounded by agricultural land.


Date and time: 1 August 2022, 15:00 hrs.

## **Identity of subject:**

King Cobra, Ophiophagus hannah (Reptilia: Squamata: Serpentes: Elapidae).

## **Description of record:**

A snake approximately 183 cm in total length (Figs. 1A and 1B) entered a house and was caught alive by a resident. The snake was turned over to the municipal environment and natural resources office for proper disposition.

#### Remarks:

The snake was identified as *Ophiophagus hannah* based on (i) a pair of large occipital scales, (ii) loreal scale is absent, (iii) one preocular, (iv) three postoculars, (v) dorsum uniform brown, and (vi) dorsal scales with black edges, more prominent on posterior body and tail (Taylor, 1922; Sy & Ong, 2019).

The King Cobra has a widespread distribution in the Philippines (Sy, 2022) and is known to occur in western Visayas on the islands of Cebu, Negros (Negros Occidental Province), and Panay (Aklan Province) (Gaulke et al., 2003; Leviton, 1965; Sy, 2016). This record extends the distribution by 133.6 km from the first record on Panay Island in Aklan Province, and provides the first record in southern Panay and Iloilo Province.
